
*3 across and 3 down totaling 9 blocks is a wallhanging (loops provided) or lap quilt and is approximately 60 " wide $\times 60$ " long $=\$ 150$

* 3 across and 4 down totaling 12 blocks is a Twin sized quilt and is approximately 60 " wide $\times 80$ " long = \$250
* 3 across and 5 down totaling 15 blocks is a Twin sized quilt and is approximately 60 " x 90 " long = \$275

* 4 across and 4 down totally 16 blocks is a Twin
 sized quilt and is approximately 72 " x 80 " long = \$300
*4 across and 5 down totaling 20 blocks is a Full at $80 " \times 90 "=\$ 350$


* 5 across and 5 or 6 down totaling $25-30$ blocks is a Full size at approximately $85 " \times 100 "=\$ 375$ $\$ 400$.

* 5 across and 6 down totaling 30 blocks is a typically a Queen size at approximately 90 " x $100 "=\$ 400-\$ 500$.

King Size quilts are typically over 30 t-shirts and are limited to 108 " across. The price starts at $\$ 600$ but can be more depending on the number of shirts involved.


Most quilts requested have sashing (the strips of fabric between the t-shirt blocks). Customers can choose any colors of solid color fabric for the sashing. Additional charges may apply if the sashing is a print (such as polka dots, gingham, stripes, floral) I use sashing to better square up the overall quilt, add a dash of design and for the overall quality of the quilt.

Cotton fabrics are used for the sashing, backing and binding. Batting is an $80 \%$ cotton, $20 \%$ polyester blend. If you want a special backing fabric like Minky or something specific - customer can provide. But this will not affect the overall price.


The quilting patterns are either a curvy grid design, a free-hand curvy design similar to a jig-saw puzzle pattern or a free-hand loopy design (similar to doodling we all did as kids). If something specific is desired, I can work with my customers to give them what they want, but there will be additional charges applied for more elaborate designs.
